The Holy Trinity

Artus Wolffort (1581–1641)

It is tempting to imagine the Resurrection itself immediately transforming timid disciples into heroes of the faith. Matthew 28:16-17 is a reminder that transformation does not happen quickly. Even after Jesus' followers saw Him alive and heard Him speak, some of them still doubted.

“The Great Commission” has not changed since the moment Jesus uttered it. Christians are to go and make disciples...baptizing them and teaching them to obey. And they are to accomplish all of this by His power and for His sake, through His Spirit. When followers of Christ are slow to share their faith or pour into the lives of others it is often because they do not really take Jesus at His word: “I am with you always.”

Notes from the Jeremiah Study Bible.

Artus Wolffort was a Flemish painter known mainly for his history paintings depicting religious and mythological scenes. In this painting, as is traditional in paintings of the Trinity, God the father is represented as an older man with a white beard. Christ has been crucified and exhibits his wounds. The Holy Spirit is shown as the dove. Commonly, the globe is held by Jesus, but in this case, the Father holds the world with a cross, as Jesus is the Savior of the World.
