Previous to this reading, Jesus had a confrontation with the Pharisees while in Jewish territory. Now, in Matthew 15:21-28, He is in the pagan lands around Tyre and Sidon. Up to this point, Jesus had healed Gentiles on Jewish land, but this would be the first in Gentile country.

The children represent Israel, the bread represents the Gospel, and the dogs represent the Gentiles. This does not imply that Jesus had disdain for the Gentiles but that He could personally reach and teach only so many during His earthly ministry (John 14:12-14).

In the above subtitle, the word “after” is a term used to denote that an artist, such as Pietro del Pò, copied the work of another artist, Carracci. This was often done by an artist, but gives recognition to the original artist who created the composition. Del Pò was far more a draughtsman than a painter. Del Pò is best known as an etcher who reproduced the paintings of the most important seventeenth-century artists. His choice of subjects reveals a preference for classical themes, and he reproduced primarily the works of Domenichino, Nicholas Poussin, Lanfranco and Carracci. In 1647, Pietro and his family moved to Rome in order to be near Lanfranco, who had just returned to the capital and for whom Del Pò had become his most useful assistant.
