Christ Calling His First Disciples 1839

Adam Brenner 1800-1891

In the Book of Mark, Jesus called his first disciples, Simon and Andrew, then James and John. Their response was immediate. What was it about Jesus' charisma that created such willingness to follow him? They had not witnessed his miraculous deeds: the feeding of the 5,000 and then the 4,000; the exorcising of demons or the healing of the blind, lepers, deaf and the lame; or bringing the dead back to life, and finally, rising from his own death.

This charisma that Jesus had must have been in his acceptance of the ordinary, sinful individual. He could read their hearts and minds and yet he did not reject them. They found a companionship with him that was addictive. They found great wisdom in his words and answers to questions by the Pharisees. Most stuck by him until nearly the end, then the fear of their own death overcame that willingness to follow him, leaving Jesus nearly alone while on the cross.

The composition of this painting is classical in its organization. The disciples surrounding Jesus all draw the eye towards the Messiah. Only one fisherman is not focused on him. Providing contrast to these faces are the dark sails behind three of the figures. The fish on the shore are forgotten in this moment, providing the visual immediacy to the invitation that Jesus is giving.

Adam Brenner was born in Vienna where he studied. He travelled around France, Switzerland and the German States.
